



ALEWIFE

Alosa pseudoharengus

Description:

- ◆ silver fish with bronze to olive back
- ◆ similar to the blueback herring
- ◆ deep body with large eye
- ◆ pearl to pale gray peritoneum (lining of abdominal cavity)

Size:

- ◆ up to 15 inches

Range:

- ◆ Atlantic coast from Red Bay, Labrador, Canada to South Carolina
- ◆ landlocked populations exist in Lake Ontario, NY's Finger Lakes and other freshwater lakes

Facts:

- ◆ anadromous fish (spends adult life in salt water but spawn in freshwater)
- ◆ begin traveling upriver in the spring to spawn
- ◆ at one month of age, young begin to move downstream
- ◆ females usually reach full maturity by age 5, males by 3 or 4
- ◆ each mature female produces between 60,000 and 100,000 eggs, depending on her size
- ◆ tend to spawn in the same stream in which they hatched
- ◆ will eat plankton, small crustaceans, and some small fish
